The overarching theme of this year's Festival is listening to δ empathizing with others, and hopefully creating real and meaningful dialogue.

In my role as Executive Director I have watched many films. In *Questions One*, a documentary, there was a quote from one of the subjects that has always stuck with me, "I don't know these people. I have to break bread with them."



Breaking bread with them is what *Gay Chorus Deep South* does so well. The San Francisco Gay Men's Chorus made a choice after the 2016 election to journey through the Bible-belt and perform in hopes of uniting different people in a time of division. I encourage you to not only watch the films this year, but also engage with your friends and strangers about the stories you have watched. It is only through this shared experience that we can come together to break bread with those who may have different views from our own and learn more about other people and their experiences.

The 2019 OUTshine Film Festival: Fort Lauderdale Edition takes place October 10 - 20, 2019. Regular film screenings will take place at the The Classic Gateway Theatre and Savor Cinema. Special Events δ Parties may take place at separate venues. Please check our event page on our website for the most up-to-date information. http://outshinefilm.com/events

Is the Festival a 501(c)3?

Yes, we are. You can download our IRS 5OI(c)(3) determination letter on our website. http://outshinefilm.com/pdf/IRS-Determination.pdf

Is the Festival Sales-Tax Exempt?

Yes, we are. You can download our tax-exempt certificate on our website. http://outshinefilm.com/pdf/Exemption.pdf

Do you play the same films in Miami and Fort Lauderdale?

No. Each festival is unique. Miami has a strong focus on international and foreign language films, while Fort Lauderdale features many American independent films. Both festivals feature unique programming with very little overlap between the two.

How can I volunteer, and what can I volunteer for?

There are many ways you can help out the Festival. You can learn more and sign up to volunteer on our website http://outshinefilm.com/volunteer OR call our office: 3O5-75I-63O5.

Who selects the films in the Festival?

There is a multi-tier process of how films are selected for the Festival, but it starts with film lovers like you. We have a screening committee made up of people like you who watch, rate, and vote on the submitted films. If you wish to become a member of the screening committee, please e-mail spc@outshinefilm.com and let us know.

Who Receives Priority Seating?

Producers Circle Members, Filmmakers, Sponsors & Media receive 1st priority seating and should arrive 3O minutes in advance. General Members get 2nd priority seating and should arrive 2O minutes before the screening.

MEMBERSHIP

How do I become a Film Festival Member?

Visit our website, OUTshineFilm.com -> Hover over the "Membership tab" -> Click "Membership Benefits" -> Click the blue "Become A Member" button.

This takes you to our ticketing website where you can chose your specific membership package. -> Click "Membership tab" -> Choose your membership by clicking the blue "Buy" button.

Is my membership good for both Miami and Fort Lauderdale?

Yes, your membership is good for a full year and does include both editions.



What are the benefits of membership?

Check out all the benefits of membership on pages 66 - 67 - A Basic \$50 membership includes Two (2) Regular Screening Tickets plus a discount on any other tickets you purchase for the Festival all year long.

Are there payment plans for Producers Circle Memberships?

Yes, there are.

Is my membership tax deductible?

Depending on your membership level, a portion of your membership is tax deductible. In January the Festival mails out tax-deduction letters for your tax return.

Do you only show movies?

No, we have a number of great events and panels during each edition as well as events throughout the year.

Where do I purchase tickets?

- 2. You can call 877-766-8156. (M-F: 9:00 AM 5:30 PM; Sat: 10:00 AM 2:00 PM)
- 3. You can purchase at our venue box-office. (I hr before the first showtime of the day until 30 mins past the last screening of the day.)

Are there physical tickets?

- I. If you order the tickets on-line, then you will receive an e-mail with your tickets as a .pdf attachment. You can either a.) print and bring with you, or b.) have scanned from your smart phone.
- 2. If you order the tickets by phone, then the same process as above.
- 3. If you purchase your tickets at the venue box-office, then you will receive a ticket there.

What's a RUSH Line? And how does it work?

When a film is sold-out, Festival staff will create a RUSH Line for patrons who do not have tickets. Unclaimed and unused tickets for the screening will be released at show-time for persons in the RUSH Line on a first-come first-served basis.

Tickets will be sold at a flat \$15 rate for regular screenings and \$25 for special event screenings--CASH only.

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



Based on the 2017 memoir written by Sid Luft, the third of Judy Garland's five husbands, Sid & Judy details their years together as well as the dramatic career and personal struggles of the talented and tragically short-lived entertainer Judy Garland. Utilitzing rare concert footage, never-before-heard voice recordings, personal photos and with John Hamm and Jennifer Jason Leigh bringing the voices of Sid and Judy to life, it's like hearing directly from the originals. While not particularly a "LGBTQ+" film, Judy Garland has long been an icon to the community and a fitting portrait like this made sense to include.

Noah finds solace in the vibrant, passionate life of a young, deaf, trans-man, Finn, who runs a center/nightclub for his deaf community. They move carefully, as this is Finn's first relationship while on his trans journey. Finn struggles to spread his wings and come into his own as he suffocates beneath his father's over-protection and the financial strife facing his club. As the two become closer, and with no shared language, they only risk hurting each other, as they learn to be true to themselves.

As new leadership in America continues to restrict immigrants and drastically cuts the flow of refugees and asylum seekers, Unsettled: Seeking Refuge in America humanizes a group about which few people know.

For over 35 years, the gay porn shop Circus of Books served as the epicenter for LGBT life and culture in Los Angeles. Unbeknownst to many in the community it served, the store was cultivated and cared for by its owners, Karen and Barry Mason, a straight couple with three children. CIRCUS OF BOOKS offers a rare glimpse into an untold chapter of queer history as it crafts an intimate portrait of the Masons and their journey to becoming one of the biggest distributors of hardcore gay porn in the United States. 


